# Parsippany zoning battle heads to court

Wildlife group: Town positioning for land-grab

A long-simmering battle between Parsippany and its largest landholder is heading to court as the nonprofit group Wildlife Preserves filed suit last month to void the council's rezoning of certain lots on its property

its property. The majority of the privately-owned acres on the preserve, in an area known as Troy Meadows, are wetlands. flood plains and environmentally-sensitive areas the group has preserved for decades. Other upland portions of the property including lots it owns between Marcia Terrace and Bennett Court in the South Beverwyck section of the township were approved earlier this year as a subdivision and became fully developable as residential lots.

Len Fariello, former mayor of neighboring Hanover and land manager for Wildlife Preserves, says the township council's recent approval of an ordinance rezoning those lots to a recreation, conservation and wildlife zone was a deliberate attempt to devalue the land "so the township can acquire the land in fee or restrict the land by easement without fair and just compensation."

"The RCW zone devalues the land and makes it easier for government and utilities to take it by eminent domain," Fariello said after the council passed Ordinance 2014:16 during a special meeting on June 2. "The zone couldn't have come at a

# Historic honor for Morris Twp. nun

Beatification ceremony to be held in Newark

MORRIS TWP. — Sister Miriam Teresa, a Sister of Charity in Convent Station until her death in 1927, will be the first American to be beatified in the United States at an Oct. 4 Mass at Sacred Heart Basilica in Newark.

The Mass, expected to overflow the 2,000-seat cathedral, will be celebrated by Cardinal Angelo Amato, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, who will travel from Rome as the personal representative of Pope Francis.
