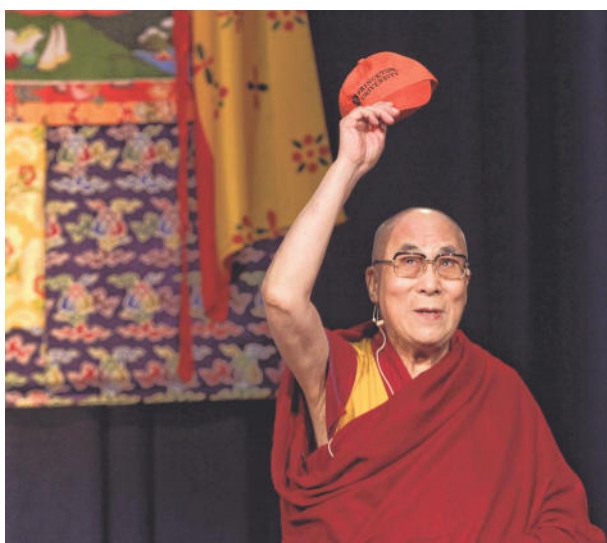

Dalai Lama in N.J.: 'We are the same'

PRINCETON — The 14th Dalai Lama taught and joked at Princeton University's Jadwin Gymnasium Tuesday as he addressed some 4,000 students on the essential role of compassion in personal and global peace.

"We really need a sense of the oneness of humanity," said the 79-year-old spiritual leader of Tibetan Buddhism.

All people come from the same source — God, he said. And all people want the same thing—happiness.

The event, titled "Develop the Heart," was presented by the university's Office of Religious Life and The Kalmyk Three Jewels Foundation. As the Dalai Lama spoke, mostly in English, for 45 minutes, and then answered questions, he sported an orange Princeton University baseball cap, given to him when he entered.

Inside the gymnasium, the thousands gathered were silent and rapt as they listened to the teachings, in contrast to outside the gymnasium where two groups of demonstrators had gathered.

One group of pro-Dalai Lama demonstrators,

Fenimore Landfill finds no takers

Tax debt on Tom's Diner in Roxbury paid at last minute

ROXBURY — Two notable properties were on Tuesday's public auction block — Fenimore Landfill and Tom's Diner — but the former received no bids, and the other's debt was paid at the last possible moment.

Bids were coming in at a rapid pace during Roxbury's tax sale Tuesday morning at town hall, with all but three of nearly 100 properties receiving bids.

Some bids went into the low six figures, but when the highest-priced property, Fenimore Landfill, was announced, not a single bid was placed.

"Crickets," said Tax Collector Mary Ann Allbrecht. Fenimore Landfill, located at 100 Mountain Road

On behalf of Ella's friends and family, Greg Maka of 24-7 Marketing LLC made the appeal Tuesday.

Elizabeth, 2½, was killed when she was caught between two shuttle buses in a parking area of Alstede Farms on Route 513. The Morris County Prosecutor's
